My Dear People

If we had continued reading the Gospel from where we left, we would be reading from Mark's version of the feeding the five thousand (6/35 ff.) However beginning today and for the next four Sundays we read from chapter six of John's Gospel. This chapter is known as the 'Bread of Life' discourse of John's Gospel.

Our First Readings too support the 'Bread of Life' discourse. Of the five First Readings we will hear four of the readings are accounts of extraordinary feedings both in the time of Elisha and during the wandering of the people of God in the wilderness. The reading on the fifth Sunday is an invitation for the people to choose which god they want to serve.

In the Gospel Jesus reveals his true identity as the bread of life. And invites the hearers to a life of union with him. He reminds us that unless we feed on his flesh and blood we will not have life. He is very forthright in saying that 'unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood you will not have life in you (6/53). The responsibility is on us whether to accept or reject. In verse 65 we see how some of the disciples stopped following him.

In today's text Jesus asks Philip where they could buy food to feed the multitude. Jesus knew what he was going to do. But both Philip and Andrew fail to understand. For Philip there is not enough money to buy food and for Andrew what was available was an impossibility to feed the crowd.

The people who saw the miracle failed to recognise the real sign Jesus gave. They tried to make Jesus a king to satisfy their own needs. Similarly the challenge for us is to ask ourselves who is Jesus for me and like Peter whether we can say 'Lord, to whom shall we go? You have words of eternal life; and we have believed, and have come to know, that you are the Holy One of God.' v68-70)

Seventeenth Sunday of the Year - (Year B)

Scripture Insights

John's account of the Gospel often gives a different version of stories told in the Synoptic accounts, Matthew, Mark, and Luke. His account of the Last Supper, for example, is remarkably different. In the Synoptics, we hear the familiar story of breaking bread and blessing wine that is part of our liturgy. But John recalls how Jesus washed feet at the Lost Supper. Eucharistic references are plentiful in John's account, however, especially in chapter 6. In the middle of Ordinary Time, the Church takes the time to read John 6 and savour the words and actions of Jesus as he talks about the bread of life and the hunger of humankind.

The chapter opens with the multiplication of five loaves and two fish. This is one of only two stories that all four Gospels relate. Jesus seems to be following in the footsteps of the great prophets like Elisha who multiplied loaves and grain, but two things set Jesus' action apart from the Old Testament prophets. First, he takes the bread and fish and gives thanks and then distributes them. Second, he has the disciples gather up what's left over. Twelve baskets of fragments are left, one for each of the disciples who doubted they could feed the multitude.

Some commentators refer to this passage as an institution of the Eucharist because of what Jesus does with the bread and the fish. There is no cup of wine, no table ceremony, no transforming

words. Nevertheless, the ritual of giving thanks and giving to others to eat is highly symbolic. Later in the chapter, Jesus uses bread as a metaphor for himself.

The crowd follows Jesus because they see the signs he does. Believing only because of outward signs is the most tenuous form of faith. At the end of the passage, the crowd wants to make Jesus king because of what they have seen. They have misunderstood Jesus' person and message. He is forced into hiding because earthly kingship is not what Jesus came for.

Thoughts for Reflection

- The Greek word eucharisteo refers to "giving thanks." Our Lord gave thanks for the bread, as the people gave thanks for food and the presence of Christ. This breaking of bread is Eucharistic and miraculous.
- We are called to "bear.....with one another through love," so that we may live in the love and peace that Christ has given his people.
- The feeding of the thousands is a Eucharistic story; thousands of people gave thanks and broke bread with our Lord.

Celebration of Mass:

At St Stephen's, we will continue to celebrate Mass socially distanced and face coverings are to be worn. Hand sanitisers should be used entering and leaving church and the 'one-way' in and out system will be in use. As long as the NHS Test, Track and *Trace* system is in operation, we will continue to make available the means for people to sign in when attending Mass using the NHS app and scanning the QR code or completing a Track & *Trace* card. It will be kept secure and will be destroyed 21 days after the Mass you have attended. A copy of the card is attached to this newsletter which you can print and complete at home to bring with you when you come to Mass. One card per individual or household group. Cards will be available in the porch at each Mass (please bring your own pen) and must be completed. Please note a card is required to be completed for <u>each</u> Mass you attend. There will be no toilet facilities open in church or the hall.

We ask everyone to respect and follow the guidance for the celebration of Mass in our church and for your cooperation and understanding so we can keep the church a safe environment for all. Many thanks to all our stewards.

Guidance for the Celebration of Mass.

This guidance has been issued by the Bishops Conference of England and Wales for the celebration of Mass.

On 19th July, the current legislative powers which assist the mitigations against the covid-19 virus transmission will be rescinded by HM
Government. Even without this legislation in place, the Church in England and Wales will be adopting a cautious approach to capacity and activity within our churches. All places of worship will have to consider the prevailing local conditions for the virus. Special consideration is to be given to rates at which people are being vaccinated in the locality, the prevalence of new variants of the virus, the local rates of hospital admissions and any local public health advice.

The Communion Rite:

The priest shows to the congregation the Host and says audibly - "The Body of Christ" and the "Blood of Christ" – and the people respond –Amen. The priest will receive Holy Communion under both kinds using his own Host and Chalice. The priest will hold a reverent silence before the Prayer after Communion, giving the Blessing and dismissal. As the people have already acclaimed the presence of the Lord, at the Priest's Communion, the distribution to the congregation of Holy Communion will be in silence with no dialogue between minister and communicant. Communion must be given in the hand only, with the communicant standing, avoiding any physical contact. People should wait in their pews until instructed to move forward in an orderly manner pew by pew by the steward, aware of the social distancing. Once you have received communion please leave the church via the side door (through the small hall) as directed by the steward. Do not return to the pew. Please use the hand sanitiser. At the end of the celebration the priest should return to the Sacristy. The Church should be closed immediately after Mass in order to clean the space and parishioners encouraged to return home.

Catholic Voices Pandemic Survey - Catholic

Voices was involved in a very successful survey and report during the first lockdown in May-July 2020. Over 2,500 Catholics in England and Wales and Scotland were surveyed, which has given us important insights into how people responded to the arrival of the pandemic. Since then a lot has changed and *Catholic Voices* would like to hear again from people about their current experiences and, crucially, what they feel about that future, so the survey is being relaunched. Donations to St Stephen's Church: Online, Contactless and Chip & Pin

In an increasingly cashless society, we are able to respond to new ways in which people can donate to St Stephen's.

We are pleased to announce that we have installed 2 Digital Collection Plates situated at the back of the church which parishioners can use whenever you come into church. Making a donation is simple and quick. Press one of the donation values e.g. £5, £10, £15, £20, £50 or Other Amount. Tap your card or phone on the card reader. For donations greater than £45, the card must be inserted at the top of the card reader with the chip facing downwards, enter your pin number and press the green arrow to confirm your donation. After tapping / inserting your card, the card reader will beep, and a blue light will show up, and screen will read payment approved. Your donation can be gift aided. The donor can complete a digital Gift Aid Declaration on the Digital Collection Plate screen and all future donations you make using this card will automatically be recorded—online and/ or in church. A Gift Aid Declaration is required when using the Digital Collection Plate for the first time even if you are registered for Gift Aid at St Stephen's. Once you have registered for Gift Aid you will receive a 'thank you' email with a copy of your Gift Aid Declaration.

You will also be able to contribute to 2nd Collections. Just choose the fund you wish to donate to and the amount you wish to donate.

Making a donation here is also simple and quick. Enter the amount you would like to give and enter your card details. Any future donations you make using this card online or in church will also be gift aided (if eligible).

Reminder: To enable the church to claim the gift aid on your donation when using your debit / credit card (online or in church) you must register by entering your name, address and email address. Once registered, all future online and in church

card payments will be gift aided (as long as you use the same payment card). A suggestion to save you time in church – you can make a small donation online (eg £1) and register your details so that when you tap your card in church you are already registered and therefore do not have to enter your details again. If you do not have an email address but would like to use the contactless / online donation device please contact the church office.

Baptism Preparation Class for parents wishing to baptise their child(ren) at St Stephen's on Saturday 24th July at 10.30am in church.

The Archbishop's Certificate (ArchCert) is an online course for all in Southwark who wish to know their Catholic faith more deeply and to develop the skills to share this faith with others. The certificate is in accord with Archbishop John Wilson's vision for a missionary diocese and is open to all who work towards this in our diocese whether in parishes, chaplaincy work, schools and in their families. We encourage those who volunteer in the parish to speak to Canon Edward about participation on the Archbishop's Certificate.

Participants will take a two-year journey through the Church's teaching to understand their faith in a more profound way and be able to share it with both confidence and joy. Students are supported with 9 online study sessions throughout the course, together with a tutor who will accompany them for the duration of the course and also with attendance at three study days (on Saturdays) at the Amigo Hall, St George's Cathedral, in Southwark. The study days combine a balance of teaching, liturgy, social time and prayer.

The course will commence in October 2021 and the cost will be £365 per year. Registration must be completed in advance.
