My dear people

Today we celebrate the Dedication Of the Basilica of St. John Lateran in Rome. I am sure many of you who have visited Rome have visited the Basilica of St. John Lateran.

The Basilica of John Lateran is the Cathedral of Rome, the cathedral or Chair at which the Bishop of Rome, the Pope presides.

The Basilica was originally named the Basilica of the Saviour. At the beginning of the 10th century the basilica was also dedicated to St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist. When Constantine became the emperor of Roman Empire, he gave the elected Pope the palace on the Coelian Hill, which belonged to the Laterani family.

This palace became the papal palace for many centuries. When the papacy returned from Avignon in the 14th century, the Vatican became the residence of the popes in place of the Lateran.

There is an important inscription in Latin in the front of the church which very often visitors miss. The words are shortened and they read—"Sacros Lateran Eccles, Omnium Urbis et orbis ecclesiarum mater et caput." which means, "Most Holy Lateran Church, of all the churches in the city and the world, the mother and the head." This inscription was placed by Pope Clement XII in the 18th century.

Since the Pope presides over the universal Church, the Lateran Basilica is called the 'mother and the head of all the churches in Rome and the world.' So today we are celebrating the church, our mother and the head, of all the churches in the whole world, not just in the city of Rome. It is the oldest and one of the four Basilicas the bishops visit during their 'Ad Limina' visit to Rome, which takes place every five years.

Today we acknowledge the primacy of the Bishop of Rome and celebrate our belongingness, our communion with the Bishop of Rome and the unity we share.

Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica (C)

About Today's Solemnity

As the cathedral church of the diocese of Rome, St John Lateran is the mother church for all Catholics. Today's feast celebrates not only the dedication of this ancient church, but also provides us with an opportunity to reflect on the role that the pope, the bishop of Rome, has in bearing witness to Christ and to preserving the unity of the Christian faithful.

Scripture Insights

The forty-eight chapters of Ezekiel are rich in imagery and complex in their message. This passage follows a description of areas of the temple and its ritual actions. Here the author describes the temple as the source of life using the imagery of a river that flows to the Dead Sea, where it brings forth new life. The language is symbolic; there are parallels to the life-giving power of God, who will deliver the Israelites from exile and give them new life.

There are two parts in today's Gospel. In the first instance Jesus drives the moneychangers from the temple precincts. Although there was a market area near the temple, Jesus objects to this commerce encroaching on the purpose of the temple. In the second part he refers to himself as the temple, a reference that begins to cause division between himself and the religious leaders; a division that will surface many times during his public ministry.

Reflections

 $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ The image of the first reading presents the Church as a

source and conduit of life-giving water, far from an authoritarian church to be obeyed. This vision guides the universal Church, offering life-giving water to local churches who then become sources of this love and hope in their communities.

• On this feast commemorating the building, we are reminded that the People of God are the Church. As much as we value sacred spaces, we would do well to pause and evaluate our relationship to church buildings, which can become idols in themselves.

Introduction to Mass

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. It may seem odd to have a feast for a church building. However, the Lateran Basilica is the cathedral church of the Bishop of Rome, the Pope. Today's feast in honour of its dedication is a reminder that we are one family, one flock, and we are led by one shepherd, the successor of St Peter.
