My dear people

A very happy New Year to you all. Yes, I did not get it wrong. A very happy new year to you all. Today, with the first Sunday of Advent, we begin the new liturgical year.

I often say Advent is one of the liturgical seasons we generally forget to celebrate. This is because the world outside is focusing their attention towards Christmas. Shopping centres, open markets with Christmas music blaring out, and our streets with all the Christmas decorations all spread the season of Christmas and we too can get dragged into it if we are not careful.

Liturgically Advent is a lovely season. Advent means 'the arrival of the Lord.' By definition Advent invites us to observe the four weeks before Christmas as a time to pray wait and remain in joyful anticipation of the notable arrival of Jesus.

The Universal norms of the Liturgical Year and the General Roman Calendar describe Advent as having a "twofold character" which remembers the 'first coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's second coming at the end of time

Beginning of any new year is marked by many unknowns. In Advent, however, we wait knowing well that the waiting period ends in Christ's birth. While we may not know when Christ's second coming would be, the church invites us to wait in joyful hope. By the third week when the midpoint of Advent is reached and we celebrate Gaudete Sunday, the season invites us to rejoice as the season quickly approaches Christmas time.

As we begin the new liturgical year, our gospel readings are from Matthew, you will notice the new parish Mass books. I take this opportunity to thank all who so generously contributed towards the purchase of these books. May God bless and reward you for your generosity.

## First Sunday in Advent (Year A)

## **Scripture Insights**

These Advent readings revolve around two themes. The first reading and the psalm offer a vision of peace centred around Jerusalem and its temple. Three times the psalm repeats a prayer for peace within the holy city. While the psalmist describes the tribes of Israel joyfully entering the temple, the prophet Isaiah sees a vision of all the nations streaming into Zion to receive instruction, a vision of international peace, of the weapons of war melted down and reforged into tools for farming.

Jesus offers the dramatic images of one man in the field and one woman grinding flour being taken while the other woman are left. Both images evoke sudden judgement. Some Christians assume that the one taken is being rescued, while the one who is left will endure the tribulation of the end times, but the Gospel suggests instead that those taken away are like those swept away by the great flood of Noah's day. Stay awake, Jesus urges, so that you might not be carried away on the day of judgement.

In Scripture, falling asleep is a metaphor both for death and for careless and self-indulgent living, living for pleasures rather than being attentive to God's purposes. Jesus reminds his followers that they won't know the hour or day of his return, which means they should live as if it might happen at any time. Likewise, Paul urges the Christians in Rome to live as if the day were about to break: the day of Christ's return is at hand.

### Reflections

- In Disney's classic film *The Lion King*, the evil uncle Scar sings "Be Prepared" to convey the importance of what is to come. Perhaps not surprisingly, fear is the underlying emotion throughout the song. Scar assures certain starvation, death, and destruction to all who hear his words but choose not to act accordingly. Preparation in this sense is nothing more than a way to avoid misery.
- Not unlike *The Lion King*, Jesus tells his disciples of the importance of preparing for the coming of God. Quite differently, however, Jesus does not capitalise on fear to promote his message, for the coming of God is not based on terror. Rather, as Christians, we wait in joyful hope for the coming of Christ. We do not prepare for the coming of God because we are afraid. Instead, we look forward to God's presence in our lives with eager anticipation for what is to come.
- Christian waiting is rooted in hope, and hope is the opposite of fear. Hope gives life; fear causes desolation. We do wait for the coming of Christ in a spirit of emptiness or loneliness. As Christians, we wait for the coming of Christ with eager anticipation and deep peace, knowing the immense happiness that comes from a relationship with God.
